According to the President of CWF Buea Station, Mme. Nchong Dexster, this year's theme is not only timely but also impactful.


"It is very timely because we are leaving in the world of so many evils; friends betraying friends, members betraying members, sisters betraying sisters. So we need to be alert of the devil and be

he Christian Broadcasting Service (CBS) Radio Buea has partnered with the Association for Community Awareness (ASCOA) to launch the Cameroon Beach Cleanup day 2024.

The event to launch the Cameroon Beach Clean-up day took place on January 20, 2024 in the Coastal Cities of Limbe and Douala. The event brought together close to 1000 volunteers under ten different local organizations.



CBS is a community radio broadcasting 60% community content and 40% religious content. And one of the Radio's thematic is Environmental Conservation. That is explains the partnership between the Radio and ASCOA, to contribute in the fight against marine pollution.

Present to launch this activity was the South West Regional Delegate of Environment, Nature Protection and Sustainable Development Set Ekwadi Songe. He used the opportunity to applaud the efforts of local organization's fight against marine pollution.

"We are not sure that as a Ministry of Environment we can work alone that is why we are happy to have partners, NGOs volunteers coming together so that we can beat plastics", he said.

The volunteers were instructed to carefully sought out the various pollutants along the Limbe coast line. Common amongst the waste are plastic bottles, leads, footwear, toothbrushes and others.

One of the volunteers, Motoko Victorine said "I am picking glass bottles and I have to separate them from plastics" she added that "from what I can see, the dirt is too much."

Activities to launch the Cameroon Beach Cleanup also included weighing different elements of waste in order to get accurate statistics. Akiambom Theophilus is incharge of weighing. He said "it is good to have data banks for statistics of these diverse waste, you mostly see leads of containers, bottles and it shows that there is a lot of waste here."

Cameroon is a signatory to the Abidjan Convention of August 5, 1984, for Co-operation in the Protection and Development of the Marine and Coastal environment of the West and Central African Region and protocol.

The general obligation of the convention states that "Contracting Parties shall, individually or jointly as the case may be, take all appropriate measures in accordance with the provisions of this Convention and its protocols in force to which they are parties to prevent, reduce, combat and control pollution of the Convention area and to ensure sound environmental management of natural resources, using for this purpose the best practicable means at their disposal, and in accordance with their capabilities."

Nigeria Defeats Cameroon Again

aturday 27th January was another night of truth between the Indomitable Lions of Cameroon and the Super Eagles of Nigeria. The Felix Houphouet Boigny Stadium in Abidjan Cote D' Ivoire, the battle ground of the 1984 Afcon final between both nations Coach Rigobert Song Bahanag in his 2 year spell with the Lions.

Song has played a total of 23 games winning 6, recording 8 draws and losing 9. To make matters worse, Song used 4 different lineups which harvested him 2 heavy defeats from Senegal and Nigeria, a draw against Guinea and a win against the Gambia.

failed to produce the same results as the winner then became the loser on this time. According to history books the last time Cameroon defeated Nigeria was at the 2000 Afcon final in Surelere Nigeria. Since then it has been successful victories for team Nigeria, 2 goals to 1 at the quarterfinals of the 2004 Afcon, 4 goals to 0 at the 1st leg of the 2018 Fifa world cup qualifiers and a 1- 1 draw at the return leg . Nigeria eliminated Cameroon at the round of 16 of the 2019 Afcon in Egypt by 3 goals to 2.

The defeat also exposed just how porous the technical and tactical bench of the Indomitable Lions has been under
