

n a bid to strengthen the PCC's South - South partnerships, the Moderator of the PCC, Rt. Rev. Dr. Fonki Samuel Forba has led a 10-man delegation for an evangelistic visit to the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Africa-Uganda (RPCAU). The delegation was made up of -



the Moderator PCC, the Synod Clerk, the National Communication Secretary, the Health Services Secretary, the Education Secretary, the Development Secretary, the National Secretary Women's Work department, the General Manager PresPrint, Elder Mrs. Njala Quan Lilian, and the Production Manager, PCC TV.

According to the head of the team the Rt. Rev. Dr. Fonki Samuel Forba this visit will improve on the structure of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Africa- Uganda and their institutions as well as encourage the pastors while learning from each other and strengthening their bond.

The visit had as activities a tour through some institutions, a workshop with elders and pastors of the RPCAU to help them



grow their church, and on the importance of a Liturgy during worship, the ordination of 19 pastors and to crown it all was the institution and induction of the Moderator of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Africa- Uganda in the person of the Rev. Mabonga Robert.

It is worth noting that the institution and induction of a Moderator in the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Africa Uganda happened for the first time in Seventeen (17) years after suffering from a leadership crisis which destabilized the Church.

Upon completion, the church is expected to accommodate three thousand (3000) Christians and stands as an attractive architecture not only for the Christians of PC Likombe but for other Christians in Fako North Presbytery and beyond.

"This worship house will serve us in many ways, this is an environment which is very quiet and I am hopeful that, it will be a good ground for us to come for retreats and most of our congregations will use this edifice better than the old one", Elder Dr. Wotany Regina, Fako North Presbytery Chairperson said.

The Moderator called on Christians to rejoice for their befitting structure worth millions of Francs CFA as he preached during the event. "May we celebrate the goodness of the Lord and may the tears of Jesus wipe away our own tears and put a smile on our faces so that we celebrate this day and thank God for this wonderful edifice and for His glory." The Moderator admonished worshipers.



Presbyterian Church Likombe is currently seeking support for the completion of the new church Project.

PC Likombe is a village congregation located at the outskirts of Buea and has so far produced three pastors for the PCC and is home to PCC's Financial Secretary.

The Synod Clerk Rev. Miki Hans Abia has saluted the resilience and contributions of the Christians of PC Likombe to the general growth of the PCC.

"When we come here today in a little village like Likombe to celebrate such a magnificent structure it is all thanks to God and it's an indication to all other communities in the Church that when we put together our efforts we can always do great things for God." PCC's Synod Clerk, Rev. Miki Hans Abia commented.

The PC Likombe project, which is an initiative of the Financial Secretary Mr. Ngole Mbuayo Ndive Mosuka started in 2021 as an idea to build a new Sunday school building but was later transformed into a full fledged project to give Christians a befitting worship house.

To make their visit remarkable, stoles were gifted to the ministers from Nigeria , an exercise led by PCC's first lady, Rev. Dr. Mrs. Perpetua Fonki, first female pastor to be ordained in the PCC.

According to the president of the PCC female pastors, Rev. Mrs. Nkep Felicia Bate, this year's event is remarkable in terms of participation. She says one hundred and three (103) female ministers answered present compared to previous years where participation has been less than seventy.

Worth noting is that this gathering holds annually every last weekend in the month of February.

"It centers all about suffering with Jesus Christ. The Ash on our forehead indicates the suffering the Israelites went through specially from Egypt, wilderness and to the promise land. Still in that believe, our Saviour and Master Jesus Christ passed through suffering , will die on Good Friday and resurrect on Easter", he highlighted.



He called on the Christians to adopt attitudes such as penitence, love for one another and thanksgiving among others during this lent season.

"It is a period that admonishes Christians all over the world to exercise Penitence, goodness, mutual understanding, love, self control, godliness, perseverance, meekness, thanksgiving and other virtues. Christians are to emulate their master Jesus Christ who passed through suffering during this lent period and conquered death", Rev. Modika said.

The Parish Pastor of Synod Office Congregation further encouraged Christians to commit themselves spiritually during this period and pray against bad habits to leave them for good.

Christians on their part say, Ash Wednesday helps to pave the way for them to begin the 40 day journey to the cross with Christ. They pray that during this period, God will help them be better Christians than they have always been.

They promised to be more spiritually inclined during this period by engaging in prayers and fasting in order to partake in the suffering of Christ and resurrect with Him on Easter.

The 40 day lent season that begins with Ash Wednesday rounds up with the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday.



PCC Mental Health Unit, Methodist Church Britain Succor Egbekaw Attack Survivors

ome survivors of the Egbekaw-Mamfe attack of November 6 2023 attack have benefited a humanitarian support from the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon (PCC) Mental Health Unit with support from the Methodist Church of Britain.

The humanitarian Package comprising, Psychosocial Support and relief Materials was delivered to the survivors during a recent visit to the Mamfe Town in Manyu Division.



The team of mental health experts was headed by the Head of the PCC Mental Health Unit, Rev. Dr. Perpetua Fonki.

For three days, the mental health experts provided a one-on-one counselling session with the survivors where they had the opportunity to share their experiences after which the experts were able to propose tips that will help the survivors deal with the trauma imposed on them because of the attack.

"we were told that when there is shooting, we should lie down, as we lay down, they broke into our house, immediately they targeted my husband", A survivor recounts. She added "after my husband was cut with machetes, he was shot on the head, I only managed to escape with my children only for me to return the following morning, the men had set fire on our house with the corpse of my husband".

It is stories like this that the mental health experts were handling in the course of their various counselling sessions. After providing the much needed psychosocial support, the survivors received basic needs including Mattresses, Rice, Salt, cubes of Soap to help them carry on with life.

"These items that you have given me will go a long way to help me and my family, we shall be reunited again because we had separated due to hunger but with these, I will call back my family so we can live together" a beneficiary testified.

Another recipient said "I am very happy because we sleeping on the floor but today I will sleep on the mattress, thank you people so much".

As part of the sustainability effort of the initiative known as the **Mamfe Emergency Arson Response Project**, the team trained seventeen Pastors and some community leaders as first responders to any eventual crisis.

The Head of the PCC Mental Health Unit Rev. Dr. Perpetua Fonki Said "after we went and implemented the project, we found out that there are still tremendous needs as far as there are concerns, most of them are homeless , grief is still intense so they need a lot of continuous work."

It is hoped that the experts will continue their quest to mobilize resources towards helping out the survivors who are still trying to move with life after the devastating event that left many dead and properties damaged.

he 2024 national bilingualism day has been celebrated in Buea, Fako Division with the call from the South West Regional Delegate of Secondary Education, Dr. Hannah Etonde Mbua for secondary institutions to improve on the level of bilingualism and digital education in their schools.

The ceremony that took place on Tuesday February 06, 2024 at the Presbyterian Comprehensive Secondary School, PCSS Buea unfolded under the theme: "Bilingualism: Vector of digitalization of education and the promotion of civic and moral values for a peaceful and emergent Cameroon".



The event that featured activities such as cultural display, ballet dance, playbacks, sketches, fashion parade, bilingual news cast, artistic and poem presentation saw the presence of the PCC Education Secretary Mr. Njie Samuel Kale, the Coordinating Inspector in charge of teaching and the promotion of bilingualism for the South West, Mme. Elive Regina, principals of colleges and other stakeholders of the secondary education sector in the region.



Addressing all , the host Principal, Mme. Elangwe Namondo disclosed that PCSS Buea prides herself as one of the pilot schools that promotes bilingualism in the region.

"PCSS Buea is one of the pilot schools that promotes bilingualism through the special bilingual education program. The first batch of students is form three, they are hardworking and very promising", the Principal said.

The Coordinating Inspector in charge of Teaching and the Promotion of Bilingualism for the South West, Mme. Elive Regina highlighted the relevance of this year's theme. She noted that the digitalization of education in schools is a work in progress.

"This year's theme is essentially based on digitalization of teaching, the Ministry of Secondary Education has the vision to digitalize education which is being effectively implemented in our schools today. We are using digital tools to teach and we are producing and exploiting digital resources that we forward to Yaounde for the distant education center", she noted.

Situating the level of bilingualism in the region, the Coordinating Inspector revealed "we have about 11pilot schools where in the special bilingual education program is being implemented, we have non linguistic subjects that are taught in the other official language, intensive English and intensive French that are been taught out of the normal core French and core English that is taught to our children. We have the special bilingual French and we have the BEPC bilingue, the Probatoire bilingue, BAC bilingue and advanced level special French".

Participatory prices were handed to the various institutions that took part in activities marking the 2024 bilingualism day in a bid to motivate them to fully incorporate digitalization of teaching and bilingualism in their schools.

Fire Ravages Over 300 Shops in the Bamenda Main Market. While Government Promises Help, Elites Raise Funds to Assist Victims

raders and business persons who lost their shops and properties during the fire incident at the Bamenda main market have pleaded with authorities to fast track the process of reconstruction and compensation. This was during an assessment and evaluation exercise carried out by the Senior Divisional Officer for Mezam, Simon Emile Mooh to ascertain the level of damage caused by the fire incident.

The Divisional boss, was accompanied by the Bamenda City Mayor, the Market Master of the Bamenda main market and forces of law and order. On their part, the people whose businesses were ravaged by



the fire estimated their loss between 3 to over 200 million francs with hopes authorities will take them out of the misery they're currently experiencing following the incident.

Speaking after inspecting over 20 shops, the City Mayor of the Bamenda city council says plans are underway for the rebuilding and restating the shop owners in their respective shops. He noted that a new market structure will be carefully designed and constructed with consideration of a vehicle passage way, and the construction of financial institutions, and insurance companies to meet the full financial needs of the buyers and sellers.

On February 22, 2024, devastating fire occurred at the Bamenda Main market in the North West Region of Cameroon. The incident left over 300 shops burnt to ashes in a market that stands as one of the largest in the largest in the region serving the economic lifetime of the population.

We encourage the traders to remain hopeful and assuring that the government will come to their assistance. We are asking them to take all conscious measures laid down by the security services. We have already lost properties, we cannot loss human beings. I want to appreciate the role of the fire fighters and the entire population who help prevent the fire from extending to other parts of the market". North West Governor, Adolph Lele L'afrique, at the scene on the day of the fire Incident".

In tears many traders, and the population at large can be seen rushing helter-skelter around the scene of the fire outbreak. Other shop owners without hope lament after watching first hand as their investments for many years go down to ashes in less than three hours.

The cause of the fire incident remains unknown at the moment, and although the firefighting unit was deployed to remedy the situation by putting out the fire, the intensity of the fire was uncontrollable and as a result it burnt to ashes several shops.

In the web of emotions, some traders blame the intensity of the flames to the multiple kiosk in every corner of the market. One of the shop owners while weeping says bitterly "I struggled to be inside this market, but they keep congesting the market, now I have lost all my goods in my shop, where do I begin from".

In assessing the damage, authorities estimated it to be in billions of CFA francs. In order to assist the victims, several elites and other public figures launched a fundraising campaign coordinated by Senator Regina Mundi, Minister Mbah Acha Rose and Minister Felix Mbuayu. Fai Yengo Francis and Edwin Fongod are also part of this group. Other donors include Minister Paul Atanga Nji.

Together with other individuals, they collected a sum of 43 million CFA francs. This sum will be distributed to the various victims. The relief effort will not stop there. The President of the Social Democrat Fund, Honourable Joshua Osih, also announced his party's donation.

North West Regional Governor, Adolphe Lélé L'Afrique, speaking on behalf of the government, announced further aid for the victims and that there will be help for the victims, and they will have to be ready to go to the commission and declare the contents of their

Abscesses 101: Everything You Need to Know About the Common but Serious Infection.

Simply defined, it is a collection of pus made up of dead cells, and white blood cells that form under the skin or in an organ due to an infection. "The signs and symptoms of abscesses generally include; swelling around affected area, the area is warm when touched, redness around the area, a whitish and yellowish appearance and fever". Said the Director of The Presbyterian Hospital, Nyassosso, Dr. Akonwi Stephen.

"The areas of the body more prone to abscesses are: armpit, pubic area, anorectal areas for superficial abscesses and internal organs. As a whole, abscesses can occur anywhere on the human body". He added.



The diagnosis of an abscess is usually based on a physical examination and a medical history. Sometimes, a sample of the pus may be taken and tested for bacteria. Imaging tests, such as ultrasound, X-ray, CT scan, or MRI, may also be done to check the size and location of the abscess. From the diagnosis, a proper management or treatment method is adopted.

" After proper medical examination from a doctor, managing or treating an abscess involves two things; antibiotics and incision and drainage. Antibiotherapy is given as specific to the type of abscess and it's severity. If the doctor judges that the abscess needs and incision and drainage, he is going to make an incision and drain the abscess properly". The medic confirmed.

Dr. Akonwi, said that abscesses are more common than people think, and they can affect anyone, regardless of age, gender, or lifestyle. He

emphasized the importance of seeking medical attention as soon as possible, as abscesses can worsen quickly and lead to serious complications and possible spread to other areas. He also warned against trying to pop or squeeze an abscess at home, as this can spread the infection.

Prevention they say is better than cure. "Firstly, maintain a proper hygiene of the skin and clothing by washing regularly to rid of any bacteria. Secondly, healthy living is very important because, Immuno suppressed patients (those who have diabetes, high blood pressure and HIV) are more prone to having abscesses. Thirdly, whenever you notice the signs and symptoms, visit your doctor for consultation and proper management". The expert advised.

Some persons believe that a boil is an abscess while others say they are two different things. As an explanation to this controversy, the doctor explained that, "a boil is a form of an abscess, but not all abscesses are boils. A boil is usually an abscess of the skin usually of the superficial layer (outermost) involving an infection of the sweat glad while a deeper or internal abscess like in the brain, liver, lungs and so on is what can be rightly referred to as an abscess".

Abscesses are serious infections that require prompt and proper treatment. By knowing the causes, symptoms, and treatments of abscesses, you can protect yourself and your loved ones from this potentially life-threatening condition. Remember, prevention is better than cure. Keep your skin clean and healthy, and seek medical help if you notice any signs of infection. Stay safe and stay healthy.
